### Reading

- Becoming familiar with the features of different text types
- Making text-to-text, text-to-self and text-to-world connections
- Making predictions before reading
- Making inferences
- Summarising what we read.

### Writing

- Creating information reports
- Identifying and highlighting key information
- Following the writing process to publish pieces of writing
- Answering questions in full sentences.

### Speaking and Listening

- Presenting information to our peers
- Using topic specific vocabulary to describe key features (e.g. population and climate)
- Contribute to conversations and discussions.

### Number and Algebra

- Renaming numbers using knowledge of place value
- Naming numbers with greater than 6 digits
- Developing more in-depth number fluency.

### Measurement and Geometry

- Comparing different units of measurement (e.g. mm, cm, m and km)
- Creating grid maps and giving directions.
- Identifying angles that are greater or less

### Statistics and Probability

- Data Collection
- Interpret different data displays
- Create suitable data displays, e.g. bar graphs.

## Inquiry
