

Art News from Prep & Grade 5/6



Prep

Last term Preps learnt about the artist Vincent Van Gogh. We looked at his famous 'Sunflowers' artwork and talked about what we could see in his artwork and what we liked about it. Using this artwork as inspiration, Preps used paper, pencils, markers, tissue paper and glue to create these colourful collages.







Grade 5/6

Last term in 5/6 we read the story 'Fox and fine feathers' by Narellle Oliver. Using the amazing animal illustrations in the story as our inspiration, the 5/6's created a Camouflaged Collage. To make these collages they used rubbing plates to add texture to their work. They cut out shapes from the papers, placed a black border around them and arranged the shapes to make a picture of an animal camouflaged in its environment.
