Building Works Update




Henny Penny Hatching

Education Week

Celebrating public education



Education Week is an annual celebration of education in Victoria. This year we celebrated Education Week from Sunday 14 May to Saturday 20 May. This year's theme was 'Active Learners: Move, Make, Motivate', which celebrates physical activity, hands-on learning and student voice in education. At St Albans East Primary we celebrated Education Week in the following ways;

Year Prep:

Our prep students participated in a 'Why Walk activity'. Students explored different movements such as crawling, running, stretching, skipping, stomping and rolling.













Grade 1/2:

Our Grade 1/2s, celebrated Education Week with a game by STEAMDANCE from The Australian Ballet-'STOP, GO, UP, DOWN' routine. This game warmed us up and to get ready for learning. It encouraged us to be aware of the space of others and ourselves as we walked around. We needed to listen, think quickly and respond to instructions.

Grade 3/4:

Grade 3/4 classes participated in a dance instruction recorded online by The Australian Ballet. Students followed the steps performed by the character Wilay, whose name means 'possum' in Wiradjuri language. This activity was purposely chosen to connect with our inquiry unit this term, First Contacts, where students have explored a variety of First Nations' languages. It also was a chance for students to move their bodies and have some fun!









Grade 5/6

The Grade 5/6s focused on 'Activating' their learning through movement and making. Each class talked about the importance of public education and how we can motivate ourselves to learn in different ways. Some classes celebrated this by playing dance games, movement games or creating their very own movie trailers. We also introduced Minecraft into Maths this week, to engage the students in learning about length, area and volume, by making their very own 'Maths Houses!' Students had a lot of fun!
