Whether you're biking or riding an e-scooter, follow these simple road safety tips to stay safe and have fun on the move!

MODIFIED OR PETROL POWERED BICYCLES

Illegal



MOTORBIKES

- To ride on or off-road it must be registered with a full or recreation registration
- · Helmet must be worn at all times.



E-BIKES

- 25 km/h MAX speed
- Motor cannot provide power at speeds higher than 25km/h
- Helmet must be worn at all times
- No passengers
- Cannot be ridden on footpaths.



E-SCOOTER

- Be aged 16 yrs or over
- Max speed 20 kmph
- Helmet must be worn at all times
- No passengers
- Cannot be ridden on footpaths.

Due to the increasing use of e-bikes and e-scooters by young people, we would like to raise awareness of the potential risks associated with their use. These devices, while convenient and popular, have been linked to a growing number of accidents and safety concerns—particularly when used without appropriate supervision, safety equipment, or an understanding of traffic laws.

To help families stay informed and support safe practices, we kindly ask that you share the attached **E-Bike and E-Scooter Safety Fact Sheet** with your family.

- Legal requirements and age restrictions
- Helmet and protective gear recommendations
- Safe riding practices and common hazards

School Wide Positive Behaviour

At SAEPS, it means we teach and reward positive behaviours that align with our school values—Respect, Responsibility, Cooperation, and Learning—so all students know what's expected and feel supported to succeed.

What Are DoJo Points

You may remember students at SAEPS receiving STAR Cards for demonstrating the school's expected behaviours; Dojo Points operates on the same principle but in a digital format.



When do students receive Dojo Points?

Inside the classroom, During Specialists Sessions and Outside the Classroom.

Dojo Points can be given out across all settings and at any time, to all students who display positive behaviours aligned with the school's matrix

What are our School Values?

At SAEPS, our Expected Behaviours are guided by the school's matrix, which is built around our core values of Respect, Responsibility, Cooperation, and Learning.



What do the students do with the Dojo Points once they have received them?

Students can redeem their cumulative Dojo Points at the DoJo Shop.

Students can redeem their accumulated Dojo Points at the SAEPS SWPBS Shop, which opens fortnightly. The shop offers a range of items priced between 20 and 1000 Dojo Points. Open during eating time from 1:30 to 1:45pm, the shop welcomes Prep to Year 2 students and Years 3 to 6 during their designated times.
